### CENTER CHURCH ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD MEETING **JUNE 8, 2025**

The Board met with 14 members and 5 guests present. Jeff Mendenhall called the meeting to order with a prayer and a devotion entitled Let the Children Come.

Mike Craver presented the treasurer's report. Minutes and treasurer's report were approved by consensus vote. The subject was brought up concerning our spending and amounts received. There was much discussion on the issue. Committee Reports:

Trustees: John Snyder reported the cleanup day went well with a good turnout of 15 men to help. The Fire Marshall inspected our facilities and made a few recommendations. 1. We have too

many extension cords in use. Please unplug them when they are not being used. 2. The double doors going into the CFC are Fire doors and should be closed especially when no one is in the building. 3. All fire extinguishers should be properly stored so they will not fall. Both of our buses are working.

Pressure Innovations cleaned our kitchen exhaust system. It should be done once a year, and this is the first time it has ever been done.

Children's Ministry: Courtney Robbins reported they have several volunteers to help with the nursery during the 9:00 service but only one for the 11:10, so she needs more volunteers for that hour. Mantle Realty wants to collaborate with us on Breakfast with Santa (what we do) and Pancakes and Pajamas (what they do). They would like us to have the event together on December 6th. The Board gave the Children's Ministry the authority to go ahead once they discuss insurance, costs, and other details.

Molly Long gave a report on the project she and Kim Craver had taken on. There are three rolls. 1. Grace Roll-people who attended but never signed into the new Center Church. 2. Preparatory Roll-those who are too young

but may join after confirmation classes. 3. Constituency Roll. This will aid us in getting the information into Church Trac.

VBS: Tina Fulcher reported she will have meetings every Wednesday at 5:00 for all those wanting to help with VBS.

Pastor Mitch Wilson said Revival is July 20-23. There will be special music and testimonies by each group. Sunday-Youth, Monday-Men, Tuesday-Women and Wednesday-Family. Center Your Spirit 2025 is the theme for our July revival.

Staff Parrish: Nathan Thanos reported they are interviewing for the nursery worker. Since they will be using Church Trac to sign children in and out of classes they will need 2 iPads or some form of a tablet. He made the motion to purchase these, and Courtney Robbins seconded it. Motion carried. John Snyder brought up the fact that as our church grows there is a need for someone to be there to help maintain, fix and clean things. We may need to look into a church facilitator one day. Back to School event is July 19th. Sunday School classes need to get involved and decide what

CCA: Deana Tiller presented the CCA Business plan for 25-26 that Kaitlyn Berrier drew up. (this plan is attached to minutes on the bulletin board with the June minutes)

They are increasing the 4-year-old preschool class from 12 to 15. This class meets Monday-

Thursday. The after-school program has a max of 28. They are doing interviews for teacher positions. They have enough interest to add a 3-Year-old preschool class. She made the motion that they add this class if the Trustees approve of a classroom for them. Nathan Thanos seconded it. Motion

The Keystone School Co Op will begin using our facilities on Mondays beginning August 11th. This is separate from CCA the two are not related. The Co Op has or will speak to the classrooms they will be using.

It was discussed about having the Board minutes and budget printed and available in digital form for members to view.

Tina Fulcher commented that we were about 100 chairs short for the Welcome School Fifth grade awards day. We may need to look into purchasing more in the future.

Due to VBS starting on our July meeting day, it was decided not to have a board meeting for the month of July. If an urgent need arises we will have a called meeting.

Pastor Mitch Wilson adjourned the meeting with prayer.
